He has had a great season so far, winning the Liam Ball race in

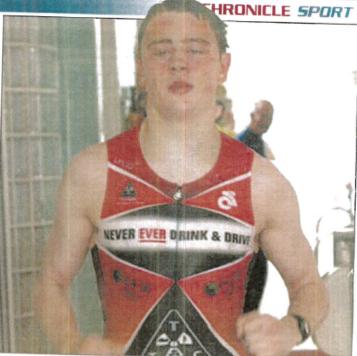
Derry and one week later, taking top spot in his home race in Limevady, both over the sprint distance.
